**Dear Parents & Carers** 

Following the confirmation by the Prime Minister last night, we are absolutely delighted to welcome all students back to school from March 8<sup>th</sup>. The school has been open to a number of students throughout Lockdown 3. During this time, we have continued to simplify and improve the effectiveness of our Covid-secure routines and we are confident that it remains a safe and productive environment.

At this stage, the school has not been given any specific detailed information to share in addition to the public announcement. ## What is our advice for exam students in years 11 & 13?

You should focus on completing your course.

You should aim for 100% attendance for the remainder of your academic year.

## What will happen between now and Easter?

There will be new and evolving procedures as part of the school day. As things change or where additional specific details are required we will share them with you.

Key things you should know for the rest of this term up until the Easter break:

- The school day will run from 8.40am 2.15pm
- There will be three 90 minute lessons with a thirty minute break in between them
- All students and staff will be offered a Lateral Flow Test for Covid-19
- Students should continue to bring a face covering to school each day
- Wherever possible break times will be spent in the fresh air
- Students will be required to bring their own food to eat during the breaks

We will continue to communicate our plans with you as we have more details and will also let you know the arrangements for after Easter.
